Forward facing child car seats will be provided for all passengers travelling on a vehicle with less than 10 seats and who weigh between 9 and 18 kg (20 to 40 lbs.). In collaboration with the local police services, bus drivers transporting young children in child booster seats will be trained in the proper installation of the equipment to ensure that the seats are firmly secured their vehicle. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian and schoostaff to ensure that students are sitting properly in theis seats and that their seat belts are buckled before the vehicle departs. Verification of a child's height and weight may be requested from the school principal, in cooperation with the parents/guardians.
